#### Our key story this half term is Elmer by David McKee

**Reading outcomes:** children will be able to identify how the author creates excitement in the story and how the motive of the main character moves the plot on

Written outcomes: children will be able to write their own version of a key story with a beginning, middle and end

We will write a recount based on Elmer's adventures: Reading outcomes: children will be able to identify the structure and language features of a personal recount

**Spoken outcomes:** children will be able to recount orally a sequence of events in chronological order using appropriate language features **Writing outcomes:** children will be able to plan a timeline and write a first person recount

## GEOGRAPHY



What is it like where we go to school?

In Geography this half term we will...

We will understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of our local area.

We will use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features. We will use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of their school and its grounds.

# SCIENCE and D&T

In Science this half term we will...

Identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense.
Describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.

- Use the basic principles of a healthy and varied diet to prepare dishes
- Understand where food comes from

# <u>MUSIC</u>

In Music this half term we will... Use our voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes Play untuned instruments musically Listen with concentration and understanding to a range of high-quality live and recorded music experiment with, create, select and combine sounds using the inter-related dimensions of music

# <u>MATHS</u>

#### We will be revising and embedding: Number

Children will learn to:

Count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number

Count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals; count in multiples of twos, fives and tens

Given a number, identify one more and one less identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least

Read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in numerals and words

#### Measurement: Length, Time, Capacity and Weight

Children will learn to: Measure and begin to record: Capacity and volume Time (hours, minutes, seconds) Recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes Sequence events in chronological order using language [for example, before and after, next, first, today, yesterday, tomorrow, morning, afternoon and evening] Recognise and use language relating to dates, including days of the week, weeks, months and years Tell the time to the hour and half past the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times.

# <u>P.E.</u>

In P.E. this half term we will...

- master basic movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching, as well as developing balance, agility and co-ordination, and begin to apply these in a range of activities.
- talk about the differences between my own and others' performances, identifying how a performance could be improved.
- Show fairness and respect to others

## <u>Art</u>

In Art this half term we will focus on Art and Design Skills...

- To explore colour when printing
- To experiment with paint mixing to make a range of secondary colours
- To draw with different media
- To understand that artists can tell stories with their work
