## SATS Information

At the end of Key Stage 1, children complete statutory assessment tests in maths and reading. We have to do these during the month of May. We will commence these in school the week beginning the 16th May and will do them over the last two weeks of the half term. We also assess writing (including spelling, grammar and punctuation), and science but these are judged using teacher assessment rather than a formal test.
